

COOLER-GEDDON

Metro will replace the six cooling towers on the Metro Headquarters building roof. A helicopter will be used to bring the old cooling towers down and lift the new cooling towers and related equipment onto the roof on the following dates:

Saturday, December 29, 2012 **Saturday, January 12, 2013***
Saturday, January 5, 2013* **Saturday, January 26, 2013**
(* Alternate for bad weather)

To ensure safety during this work, the Federal Aviation Administration has required the following closures from 6:00 am to 4:00 pm on those dates:

- Cesar Chavez Ave. and Vignes St. adjacent to the Headquarters Building
- Gateway parking garage
- Patsouras Plaza (and detour of buses from the plaza)
- The three Union Station tracks closest to the Headquarters Building

WHAT SHOULD EMPLOYEES DO?

Metro, Metrolink and LASD employees who are required to work in the building on those dates are encouraged to use public transit and may enter the building **ONLY** through the parking elevators via the East Portal. Since the garage will be closed, parking arrangements for employees who must drive will be forthcoming.

WHY IS METRO REPLACING THE COOLING TOWERS?

The cooling towers, an important part of the building's air conditioning system, are near the end of their useful life. We are doing this project during cool weather to ensure they are in good working order when the weather heats up again next summer. The new cooling towers will also use less energy and reduce costs.
