#### **Metro Offers Alternatives To High Gas Prices**

A Metro Networks radio news reporter (KABC) interviewed Metro Public Relations staff today re: Metro's higher ridership in the wake of rising gas prices and other rideshare options available to the public including the school pool program.

### **High Fuel Costs**

The Daily News interviewed Metro staff today about the impact of the rising fuel prices as a follow-up to an earlier interview in late April about the cost of fuel purchased by Metro. Information that was presented at the Operations Committee Meeting yesterday was given to the reporter regarding the budget projections and fuel costs based on this week's rates. #### Santa Fe Yards Joint Development Project

The Downtown News is preparing a story regarding a proposed Metro joint development agreement with Polis/McGregor Santa Fe Yards, LLC covering approximately 2.7 acres of Metro-owned properties located at the Metro Red Line/Santa Fe Yards Maintenance of Way facility for the development of a mixed-use, apartment/retail complex. Artist renderings of the proposed project were provided to the reporter.

The Planning and Programming Committee, staff requested that the item be carried over to next month to assess the impacts relating to the lease/leaseback agreement.

#### **Federal Transportation Appropriations**

KFI radio interviewed Metro staff today regarding the recently approved transportation funding bill. Staff outlined the various transportation projects that received funding in the bill. Stories may air tonight and throughout the weekend.

## **Update on Contract Bus Services Labor Issue - Day 19**
