Metro Orange Line Update

Operations staff at Division 8 continues to train 3-4 operators a day. Over 150 operators have been trained to date along with eight Transit Operations Supervisors and at least 20 mechanics. Operations, Construction and the contractor continue to work together in meeting deadlines for testing and certification of the line for operation as well as planning for two emergency drills that will involve cooperation between police, fire, Metro staff and others. Beginning, October 16th, we will begin operating a simulated daily schedule in preparation for opening day.

Metro Orange Line Media Test Ride - Friday, September 30, 2005

Join us for a test ride on the Metro Orange Line's Metro Liner. During this ride, we will have one or two Metro Liners pass us along the route to give us the full "passenger" experience. This media event is scheduled for Friday, September 30 at 10:00 a.m. If you are planning to attend, please arrive a few minutes prior to 10:00 a.m. at the Metro Orange Line eastern terminus station at Lankershim and Chandler for the test ride to Warner Center and back.

<u>Big Rig Tow Media Event – Monday, October 3, 2005</u> Attend a media event for the first day of the Big Rig Towing service on the I-710 Freeway. The Metro Freeway Service Patrol Big Rig Tow Service will operate 5 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Friday exclusively along an 18-mile stretch of the heavily congested I-710 Freeway. The new service is the first of its kind in the nation focused on freeway congestion caused by freight and goods movement. The event is scheduled for Monday, October 3, 2005 at 10:00 am and will be held at the Los Angeles Intermodal Facility of the BNSF Railway Company at 4940 Sheila Street in Los Angeles.

UCLA Go! Metro Pass Press Event - Thursday, October 6, 2005

Metro and UCLA will announce the debut of the UCLA Go! Metro Pass program for UCLA students during the school's Transportation Fair held to commemorate Rideshare Week, which is October 3 to 7. The new Go Metro Pass gives UCLA riders the convenience of an unlimited Metro Bus and Metro Rail pass at significantly reduced fares. UCLA is the first major university campus to take advantage of our Institutional Pass Program. Students and employees may purchase this pass on quarterly basis. The event is scheduled for Thursday October 6, 2005 at 10:00 am and will be held at the UCLA's Bruin Plaza.
