REVISED: Los Angeles County Earmarks in FY07 Transportation Appropriations Bill

Please find attached a slightly revised earmark list from the Fiscal Year 2007 Transportation, Treasury, Housing and Urban Development bill that was adopted by the House Committee on Appropriations earlier this week. Two earmarks (Santa Clarita Cross Valley Connector & I-210 Soundwall in La Canada) were inadvertently omitted from the document which was circulated in yesterday's Daily Brief.

Archstone Del Mar Station Development Opens

I along with the Mayor of Pasadena, Bill Bogaard, joined representatives from Archstone-Smith today to celebrate the opening of the Archstone Del Mar Station along the Metro Gold Line. The project is billed as the first transit-oriented, mixed-use apartment development project built in Los Angeles County. Several media outlets covered today's opening and stories are expected to run this afternoon and tomorrow. Metro's Roger Moliere hosted a rolling tour of transit-oriented developments (TOD's) as guest to the event rode on a special Metro Gold Line trains from Union Station to the Del Mar Station.

Metro Reroutes Buses Off Of Spring Street Contra Flow Lane

Media Relations distributed a news release today noting that effective June 18 all Metro Buses operating on the Spring Street contra flow lane (north bound) will be rerouted to either Main and Hill streets or Grand and Olive. The rerouting of buses is necessary due to the conversion of the north bound bus only lane on Spring Street between 1st & 9th streets in downtown Los Angeles to a south bound only operation by the LADOT.

Of Note

On this day, Metro provided 25 buses to shuttle mourners from the Moorpark College parking lot to the Ronald Reagan Library in Simi Valley. Thousands came to pay respects to President Ronald Reagan who died June 5 at the age of 93. First Lady Nancy Reagan hand wrote personal thank you letters to the employees of Metro for their support.
