#### **Governor's Small Business Assistance Program**

As reported in Friday's Daily Brief, Governor Schwarzenegger announced the creation of a program to assist small businesses participating in highway and public transportation projects. This program has many elements such as the creation of new position in Business Transportation and Housing to assist small businesses and the expansion of a program used by District 7 to encourage small business participation. The program also includes the creation of a State Transportation Bonding Guarantee Program which will assist small businesses including Disadvantage Business Enterprises attempting to compete on transportation projects.

The Bond Guarantee program will use \$40 million from the FY07 Public Transportation Account Spillover funds and will sunset in 10 years. The PTA funds are to be repaid when the program sunsets. LA County would lose about \$7 million based on how we currently understand the program to be structured. Caltrans staff have indicated that they intend to pull funds from the Spillover in the same manner that Spillover was allocated this year: 80% would come from the State Transit Assistance Account and 20% would come from the STIP. Government Relations staff have been working with Legislative leadership and the California Transit Association to explore options to minimize the impact of this proposal. One option would be to modify the way in which funds would be taken out of the PTA so that more funds come from the STIP than from the STA. This would accomplish two objectives. First it would reduce the overall loss of funds to the County. Second it would minimize the impact to the region's operating funds.

The next step in the process is that the Administration will submit legislative language for consideration by the Legislature in August. Staff will continue to monitor the development of this program and will keep the board informed of any new developments.

## **Metro Service Sector Public Hearings**

Media Relations distributed a news release this afternoon noting four upcoming public hearings scheduled for early August by four of the five Metro Service Sectors. The public is encouraged to attend the public hearing in their community to provide input on proposed service changes and service improvements planned for implementation in December.

#### Of Note

On this date in 1951, Governor Earl Warren signed a bill creating the Los Angeles Metropolitan Transit Authority (LAMTA), the first publicly governed transit planning agency for Los Angeles. The LAMTA initially focused on planning a monorail-based mass transit system to replace what remained of the Pacific Electric and Los Angeles Railway systems. LAMTA would go on to become the region's first publicly governed transit operator on March 3, 1958 serving Los Angeles, Riverside, San Bernardino and Orange counties. Weak powers and a desire for improved elected representation on its board led to LAMTA's replacement by

## predecessor agency Southern California Rapid Transit District (1964-1993) in September 1964.
