Traffic Safety N Kids Summit

Metro will be presented with an Award of Extraordinary Achievement by WCBS TV Traffic Reporter, Vera Jiminez, at the annual [Traffic Safety N Kids Summit](#) held this week at the Warner Center Marriott Hotel in Woodland Hills. This year's Summit is sponsored by the Los Angeles Unified School District, the California Highway Patrol, the City of Los Angeles and the California Office of Traffic Safety. The event, held today through Thursday, is expected to be attended by 300 to 500 Southern California professionals to explore and offer new concepts, programs and ideas on how to solve the traffic problems that cause injuries and death to children. Metro's Transit Education Manager, Barbara Burns, is a featured speaker at three sessions where all of Metro's award winning safety videos will be discussed and distributed. Other speakers at the summit include Los Angeles City Councilmember, Wendy Greuel and City Attorney, Rocky Delgadillo.
