House Democrats Name Key Committee Chairmanships

Earlier today, the House Democratic Caucus formally approved a slate of key committee chairmanships recommended by the incoming Democratic leadership. In a private caucus meeting, Democrats voted to install the following members to chair the House's four "exclusive" committees: David Obey (D-WI), Appropriations Committee; John Dingell (D-MI), Energy and Commerce Committee; Barney Frank (D-MA), Financial Services Committee; and Charles Rangel (D-NY), Ways and Means Committee.

Later this week, the Democratic Caucus will take action on the remaining committee chairmanships. At that time, Congressman James Oberstar (D-MN) is expected to be approved as the incoming chairman of the Transportation and Infrastructure Committee.

President Bush Orders Homeland Security Officials to Strengthen Transportation Security

Yesterday, President George W. Bush requested that Homeland Security Secretary Michael Chertoff draft an action plan for strengthening security measures in and around America's transportation infrastructure. The President's plan, which he ordered to be completed within one month, will address security measures for mass transit, freight rail, commercial vehicles, highways and pipelines. The President's executive order singles out "high risk targets" and

calls for the immediate development of a national plan to identify and close existing security gaps. It is widely expected that Secretary Chertoff will work closely with U.S. Transportation Secretary Mary Peters to deliver a security plan to the White House by December 31st.
