## Los Angeles Times Inquires About New Start Funding in President's Budget

A Los Angeles Times reporter from Washington, who is writing about the President's budget proposal, asked if the proposal included funding for the Purple Line extension and the Regional Connector. Staff noted that it includes \$130 million for the two projects, \$65 million each, for Fiscal Year 2014. The two projects should also secure full funding grant agreements by the end of this calendar year. Government Relations staff told the reporter that this is very positive news and added that, historically, Metro has averaged approximately \$80 million in annual federal New Starts funding so the proposed \$130 million is 60 percent higher than the norm.
