I hope many of you were able to make it to the live audience viewing, or viewed the live stream, of our first-ever All Hands TV Show. It was an entertaining agency-wide meeting that I hosted while sitting behind a desk and interviewing six "guest speakers" who spoke about specific projects or initiatives they are leading at Metro. Audience members and live stream viewers, including all Metro Divisions, had an opportunity to listen to topics ranging from Metro's participation in GARE - a national network of government agencies working to achieve racial equity, Metro's NextGen project and where we are at with the project's timeline, Metro's "How Women Travel Study" and initiatives launched from this study, Metro's work on a Customer Experience Plan and an update on Systems Security, Law Enforcement and other initiatives. I received excellent comments, recommendations and questions from some of you including this one below that I think we all should remember:

When I walk to the Starbucks to buy my morning coffee I grab a Metrolink timetable to be ready to help someone find their way to the right track or I guide them to

If a family member or friend would ever visit another state or country and they are using public transportation and need help I would hope that someone would take the time to help them.

Los Angeles Area Chamber of Commerce Hosts State of L.A. Infrastructure

On Wednesday, I attended the Los Angeles Area Chamber of Commerce's event, *State of L.A. Infrastructure* where I participated on a panel, "Smart Cities, Smart Infrastructure." Leaders from the public and private sector convened at the Omni Hotel in Downtown Los Angeles to discuss the current and future infrastructure

needs of Los Angeles with conversations on resilience and smart cities which transcends all infrastructure sectors. On our "Smart Cities" panel, I discussed the importance of state of good repair, fare payment integration and connectivity, and understanding the technology we currently have before continuously moving toward new technology. I closed with the fact that people on the local level understand the value of infrastructure investment as we have seen local ballot initiatives passed to fund infrastructure. It is important that we strengthen partnerships between cities, counties and the private sector to advance infrastructure and state of good repair work.

Leadership Academy Promotions

The Metro Leadership Academy will be graduating its 4th class next month. This 12-month program has attracted over 150 employees who have committed themselves to learning and development, beyond their regular roles at Metro. The program leaves participants with a heightened awareness of personal leadership style, enhanced self-confidence, individual influence and leadership development for a stronger corporate succession plan. The participants are responsible to undertake a major project and present recommendations to the Senior Leadership Team; this work is done within a small team and generally requires time beyond their regular schedule. The results of their hard work have been demonstrated in a recent analysis of promotions within Metro. Since the Leadership Academy's inception in January of 2016, the program has seen 49% of current and past participants receive a promotion and 10% of current and past participants having received two or more promotions. To further support and prepare all participants for career growth and to be competitive in selection processes, all participants receive an additional 6-months of supervisory experience to add to their resume at completion of the program.



Construction Notices: Regional Connector, Purple Line Extension, I-5

Regional Connector: Street Restoration closures at 1st/Alameda in DTLA

Street restoration at the 1st St and Alameda St intersection is now scheduled to start January 10, 2020. Plan ahead as lane reductions and road closures will be in place through the summer, as this work will be completed in two stages, each lasting approximately four months.

Purple Line Extension: Orange Grove Closure at Wilshire Blvd

Orange Grove Ave. south of Wilshire Blvd. and north of 8th St. will be closed for 8 months starting Friday, October 18. The existing sound walls will be extended west to surround the closure area, which is required to construct the Wilshire/Fairfax Station. Residents of Orange Grove Ave. will continue to have access.
