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
#### Congress Adopts Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act

Last week, Congress adopted The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act – which was promptly signed into law by the President. The legislation includes over \$2 trillion in COVID-19 related funds, including hundreds of billions of dollars for direct payments to Americans, billions of dollars to bolster the nation's unemployment insurance programs, and billions of dollars to bolster the transit industry, among many other national fiscal priorities. I have communicated with all members of the Los Angeles County Congressional Delegation to express our appreciation for the financial assistance for Metro and other transit agencies that was included in H.R. 748 – the CARES Act.

Specifically, for transit agencies nationwide, the bill would provide \$25 billion. According to preliminary estimates by Metro's staff, our agency may receive approximately \$710 to \$810 million in assistance – with specific terms on how these funds can be spent on matters directly related to the COVID-19 pandemic. Metro will, over the coming days, be working with relevant federal authorities, including but not limited to, the U.S. Department of Transportation and members of the Los Angeles County Congressional Delegation, to ensure our agency takes all reasonable and prudent steps to allocate these important federal resources to their highest and best use in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic.

## Arbitrage Rebate Calculation Services (RFP)

Metro released a Request for Proposals (RFP) for Arbitrage Rebate Calculation Services. The procurement process blackout period is expected to run from Wednesday, March 25, 2020 through Thursday, June 4, 2020.

The Arbitrage Rebate Calculation Services consultant shall furnish all labor, tools, and equipment to provide arbitrage rebate calculation services to Metro in support of its outstanding debt issues. The tasks will include, but shall not be limited to, the collection and maintenance of records relevant to the preparation and submittal of arbitrage rebate analysis reports.

#### Door Enable System (RFP)

Metro released a Request for Proposals (RFP) to procure a door enable system. The Project Labor Agreement/Construction Careers Policy will apply to this Procurement. The procurement process blackout period is expected to run from March 27, 2020 through August 19, 2020.

Metro has established a contracting opportunity for a responsible contractor to provide a turnkey solution to include design, supply, installation, and testing of an integrated Door Enable System (DES) that meets Metro's proposal requirements as outlined in the Statement of Work. The DES shall be installed on Light Rail Vehicles (LRV) or on Wayside system that operate on the Blue, Gold, and Expo Lines.

Regional Connector: Street Restoration closures at 1st/Alameda in DTLA

Street restoration at the 1st St and Alameda St intersection is now underway and scheduled to last through August 31, 2020. Plan ahead as lane reductions and road closures will be in place through the summer, as this work will be completed in two stages, each lasting approximately four months.
