

# **CNN International Interview on Fareless System Initiative**

On September 16, I provided a brief live interview for CNN International's "Quest Means Business," a one-hour business show anchored by CNN's global business editor Richard Quest on, among others, Metro's Fareless System Initiative. I fielded a number of questions about Metro's plans to study the possible elimination of Metro fares and reported that Metro will evaluate local, state and federal funding opportunities, including re-prioritizing Metro funds to replace farebox revenues. The taped interview is now available on CNN's YouTube Channel.



Last week, I participated in the virtual Mobility 21 Summit along with Metro Board Chair and Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti who delivered the luncheon keynote address. I participated in the closing session panel: *Equity and Recovery – CEO's Roundtable* where we discussed our response to the challenges faced by countries around the world and in our own communities in Southern California. Specifically, challenges of experiencing the simultaneous consequences of a global pandemic and long-standing racial injustice. The panel included the leading transportation executives of Southern California who shared how they are dealing with the intertwined issues of equity and recovery during the ongoing emergency and throughout the coming year. I shared how transportation agencies have tremendous power to influence, instigate and inspire. Transit CEOs can do this through infrastructure investment, planning and land use policy, affordable housing, transit-oriented communities, employment and hiring, education and internship opportunities. I believe transit CEOs should be stepping into leadership voids and that there is no better time than now to do so.

Thank you to our regional transportation partners, Metro staff who participated and helped coordinate logistics and to the Mobility 21 team for another excellent summit.

#### **Service Councils Voting on NextGen Bus Plan**

Following the six public hearings last month, our Service Councils are now voting on the NextGen Bus Plan at their meetings this month. Last week, the South Bay and San Fernando Valley Service Councils each voted to approve the NextGen Bus Plan proposals for their areas. The remaining Councils will consider the changes proposed for their areas at their meetings this week beginning tonight:

- San Gabriel Valley: Monday, September 21 at 5:00 p.m.
- Westside Central: Wednesday, September 23 at 6:00 p.m.
- Gateway Cities: Thursday, September 24 at 6:00 p.m.

Following these Service Council meetings, staff is finalizing their recommendations for the NextGen Bus Plan that are scheduled to be presented to the Board of Directors for their consideration in October.

## Metro Supports Local Agencies' Grant Applications for Active Transportation

As part of Metro's Grant Assistance Program, 17 grant applications from 11 local agencies were submitted to Cycle 5 of the State Active Transportation Program (ATP) on September 15, 2020. The total funding request was \$190 million for projects valued at \$242 million. The project selection and application development process for ATP Cycle 5 spanned 9 months and involved consultant services and Metro staff from across Countywide Planning and Development.

Metro's Grant Assistance Program provides grantwriting services to projects that are seeking funding from the State ATP. Since it began in 2013, the Grant Assistance Program has resulted in \$234 million of ATP awards for projects valued at \$348 million. These awards support projects that help complete the Los Angeles River Bike Path, expand bike share, and strengthen first/last mile connections to transit. To select projects for grant assistance, Metro staff evaluates the potential of projects to support implementation of Metro's active transportation plans and policies, prioritizing assistance to local agencies with resource or technical limitations and projects that will benefit disadvantaged communities.

The California Transportation Commission will evaluate ATP Cycle 5 applications statewide, and adopt awards in March and June 2021.

#### **Outreach Workshop for our Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise**

On Tuesday, August 25, Metro's Contractor Development and Bonding Program (CDBP) hosted an Outreach Workshop for our Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise (DVBE) community. The workshop was held virtually via Zoom and featured a new recipient of Metro's bonding program.

Ron Escobar, owner of Escobar Construction, is certified as a DVBE and gave testimony to the benefit of Metro's CDBP program and how helpful Merriwether and Williams have been in assisting him to increase the capacity of his construction company. He also mentioned his gratitude to Metro for implementing and funding such a program and not just talking

about supporting small businesses at outreach events. He ended his presentation by saying, "Trust me! The program works!"

Over 60 small business contractors attended the DVBE outreach event which included presentations by Gene Hale, CEO of G & C Equipment Corporation, Merriwether & Williams, and Metro staff. Keith Compton, Director in Metro's DEOD, Capacity Building and Data Integration, provided attendees with information on how to do business with Metro, how to find Metro resources, and upcoming contracting opportunities.
