Backed by Bonelli

At the same time, Supervisor Frank G. Bonelli came to the defense of Alweg and its competitor, Goodell Monorail. Both have offered to build so-called privately financed transit systems here.

Bonelli told an Assembly investigating committee in the State Building that the MTA has a "negative attitude."

"The authority believes that only its backbone route (a duo rail system), requir-

monorail backers ing tax subsidy, will stand the Metropolitan up," he said.

Scheduled Hearings

Assemblyman Tom Carrell (D-San Fernando), committee chairman, scheduled the hearings at Bonelli's suggestion after the MTA rejected offers by Alweg and Goodell to build overhead systems.

The supervisor told Carrell's committee that any tax proposal, as advocated by the MTA, would "go down the drain" if it were put to a vote of the people.

"Anything short of reconstruction of the MTA is not going to give Los Angeles the rapid transit system it needs," Bonelli declared. Later he backed up his

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
