8-foot Whale Skull, Giant Serpent and Colorful Mural

TRIUMVIRATE OF ART PAYS HOMAGE TO REAL AND MAKE BELIEVE BEASTS THAT ROAMED CYPRESS PARK & ORIGINAL INHABITANTS

WHAT: Three very unique works of art, part of revitalization efforts in Cypress Park, will debut. The eclectic trio is located in Taylor Yard on a parcel owned by the MTA (two are next to a future 30-acre state park) and used by Metrolink. MTA commissioned three artist teams to create: an impressive 8-foot tall prehistoric whale skull (*artist Jackie Dreager*) cast from an actual skull discovered in Elysian Park in 1931 and, now at the Natural History Museum; a pedestrian walkway resembling a 150-foot serpent with a tongue and eyes that light up at night (artists *Robert Villagómez and Quito Hernandez*); and a dazzling painted mural wider than a drive-in movie screen depicting Native American history on Metrolink's maintenance hangar (artist team *Sindicato Regeneración*). After artists receive certificates of appreciation, media can walk less than 100 yards to view the prehistoric/mythological theme artwork and/or take a van to see the mural.

Directions to Taylor Yard Press Event

Golden State (5) Freeway

Southbound:

- Take the Pasadena Freeway-Los Angeles off ramp (first exit after Stadium Way)
- Keep left and take the Figueroa Exit
- Turn right at the corner onto Riverside Drive
- Continue over the bridge
- Riverside Drive turns into Figueroa Street
- Go two blocks
- Make left onto Avenue 26
- Make a right onto San Fernando Road
- Go a half a mile to the Taylor Yard Private Access Road
- Make a left onto private access road
- The Taylor Yard Historic Tower is on the corner of San Fernando and private access road
- Make a left into first driveway onto Parcel C
- Park

Golden State (5) Freeway

Northbound:

- Take the Pasadena Freeway off ramp (first exit on right after Broadway)
- Stay on the right hand side
- Take the Figueroa exit
- Turn left onto Avenue 26
- Make a right onto San Fernando Road
- Go a half a mile to the Taylor Yard Private Access Road
- Make a left onto private access road
- The Taylor Yard Historic Tower is on the corner of San Fernando and private access road
- Make a left into first driveway onto Parcel C
- Park

Pasadena (110) Freeway

Southbound

- Take the Avenue 26 exit (first exit on right after Golden State Freeway offramp)
- Turn right onto Avenue 26
- Make a right onto San Fernando Road
- Go a half a mile to the Taylor Yard Private Access Road
- Make a left onto private access road
- The Taylor Yard Historic Tower is on the corner of San Fernando and private access road
- Make a left into first driveway onto Parcel C
- Park

Pasadena (110) Freeway

Northbound

- Pass through the tunnels (near Dodger Stadium)
- Stay on left lane
- Take Figueroa Street Exit (exists toward the left and is right after the Golden State Freeway off ramp)
- Turn right onto Figueroa
- Stay in the left lane
- Turn left at Avenue 26th
- Make a right onto San Fernando Road
- Go a half a mile to the Taylor Yard Private Access Road
- Make a left onto private access road
- The Taylor Yard Historic Tower is on the corner of San Fernando and private access road
- Make a left into first driveway onto Parcel C
- Park
