SUBJECT: PROPOSED SERVICE CHANGES TO MTA SAN GABRIEL VALLEY SECTOR

SERVICES

ACTION: ADOPT FINDINGS OF PUBLIC HEARING AND APPROVE

RECOMMENDED SERVICE CHANGES

RECOMMENDATION

- A. Adopt the findings of the Public Hearing conducted on Tuesday, February 10, 2004 concerning proposed service changes to Metro San Gabriel Valley Sector services (Attachment A and A-1); and
- B. Approve the San Gabriel Valley Sector Change Program as outlined in this report and shown on Attachment A1 and B.

ISSUE

In compliance with federal public hearing requirements and adopted MTA policy, the Governance Council is required to conduct public hearings whenever major changes in bus service are proposed to be implemented. As part of the process, the Council is required to solicit and consider public input on these matters prior to taking action on changes of this magnitude. The changes proposed for implementation in the San Gabriel Valley Service Sector meet these requirements. The public hearing is the initial step in meeting the overall requirement.

POLICY IMPLICATIONS

The changes are proposed to improve the quality of bus service operated in the San Gabriel Valley – East Side service area. The implementation of the Soto Street Rapid Bus and Valley Boulevard Limited stop service would improve bus travel speeds. The replacement of the far eastern segments of the two longest bus lines in the MTA system, with a new shuttle route, should greatly improve the on-time performance along these bus routes. All of the changes contained in this program have been evaluated to ensure coordination with the principles outlined in the proposed Los Angeles County Mobility Enhancement Project (Metro Connection Project). The first phase of that project is tentatively scheduled for implementation in December 2005.

In an effort to move forward with projects that will produce operating efficiencies, staff is proposing to start some of the projects contained in the public hearing program as early as June 27, 2004. These changes will focus on improving transit travel speeds in selected corridors and restructuring service to improve on-time performance and operating efficiencies.

ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED

An alternative to the current staff recommendation is for the Council to not approve the service program, or approve only a subset of the recommended program. Both alternatives are discouraged for two reasons.

As noted earlier, the proposed service program calls for improving bus speeds and service quality and ontime performance. The proposed service changes would implement a new Rapid Bus and limited stop line to improve bus speeds. In addition, the two longest bus routes in the MTA system are proposed to be shortened with a new shuttle replacing the eliminated route segments. This action is designed to improve service quality by improving schedule adherence. Retaining the current route structure would not improve bus speeds or on-time performance.

Summary of Staff Proposals

The proposed service plan is comprised of several elements. They include: new limited service along Valley Boulevard, the cancellation of limited stop service along the Soto Street corridor, new Rapid Bus replacement service along Soto Street, restructuring two routes in the City of Pomona, and new shuttle service between Brea Mall in Orange County and the City of Pomona. A brief description of the individual proposals is contained in the following:

- Establish new limited stop service along Valley Boulevard between the Lincoln Heights area of Los Angeles and the City of Rosemead.
- Establish new Rapid Bus Line 751 along Soto Street between Cypress Park and the City of Huntington Park. Cancel Line 350 Soto Street Limited service.
- Discontinue Line 484 route segment between Cal Poly Pomona and the Pomona Transportation Center.
- Restructure Lines 484 and 490 to operate between Downtown Los Angeles and Cal Poly Pomona. Cancel the route segment of Line 484 between Cal Poly and the Pomona Transportation Center and Line 490 segment between Cal Poly and Brea Mall.
- Establish new shuttle Line 684 to serve discontinued route segments of Lines 484 and 490.

The proposals are shown in more detail as part of Attachment A.

BACKGROUND

These changes were included in the February 2004 Notice of Public Hearing published in the San Gabriel Valley Tribune in early January, 2004. Legal notice was also provided in local area newspapers throughout the service area. Publications dates for the notices are on file with the Board Secretary's Office. In advance of the public hearing, approximately 300,000 public hearing brochures were made available on buses and trains system-wide.

Prior to the public hearings, two community meetings were held at Cal Poly Pomona and Plaza De La Raza in the Boyle Heights area of the City of Los Angeles to gather additional input on the proposed changes. The public hearing followed on Tuesday, February 10, 2004, at 6:00 p.m. in the San Gabriel Valley Sector Office in El Monte. The purpose of the hearing was to obtain formal public comment on all of the service change proposals under consideration.

Results of Community Meetings

Between the two community meetings, there were twelve attendees. Input from the attendees focused primarily on reducing the time between buses for passengers required to transfer between restructured Lines 484 and 490 and the new shuttle Line 684.

Results of Public Hearing

Eight individuals attended the Metro San Gabriel Valley public hearing. Four of the total number presented verbal testimony to the hearing officer. By the close of the public hearing comment period, verbal and/or written testimony had been received from nine respondents.

In general, the proposal to add new limited service on Valley Boulevard and Rapid Bus service in the San Gabriel Valley received support. One respondent requested and supported the start-up of Rapid Bus service along Valley Boulevard corridor. By contrast, proposals to establish a shuttle to replace discontinued route segments of Lines 484 and 490 were generally opposed by those who commented. Most requested that the services proposed for cancellation either be retained or supported a timed-transfer at night between services operating in the vicinity of Cal Poly Pomona. Concern was also expressed about the lack of adequate lighting at bus stops in the area. One respondent suggested that MTA look at combining Foothill Transit service and the Line 490 route segment operating through the Diamond Bar area. Written testimony included four e-mails and one letter from riders who opposed the modifications to Lines 484 and 490 and the cancellation of Line 350. Input centered on concerns about adding transfers without timed-transfers, travel time impacts, and increase costs for transit users.

Attachment A-I contains a summary of all public testimony received on these matters. Comments are arranged by line number and by topic. Staff has responded to each comment. The affected lines with revised recommendations are described in the staff response section of the above referenced attachment.

Other Issues

The Consent Decree does not prohibit the MTA from managing the bus system to ensure efficient and effective operations. Efforts have been taken to minimize impacts to riders affected by the staff proposals. Staff proposes to schedule meetings with the BRU to mitigate any concerns expressed about the service change program.

Summary of Revisions to Service Change Proposals

Based on public input and review of the range of impacts associated with proposals presented at the public hearing, staff recommends implementing the program as originally proposed with one exception. To the extent possible, timed-transfers at night will be established in the Cal Poly Pomona area to alleviate concerns about wait-time between buses.

This information was presented at the community meetings as well as at the public hearing. Sector staff will continue to work with other operators to minimize fare impacts and coordinate operating schedules to minimize impacts to affected riders.

NEXT STEPS

An outreach plan will be developed and implemented to ensure adherence to guidelines established for implementing both major and minor service changes. Authorized changes will be implemented in June 2004 or later.






ATTACHMENT A MAPS OF SERVICE PROPOSALS FEBRUARY 10, 2004 PUBLIC HEARING


Proposed Line 76-376 Valley Boulevard Limited Service






Restructured MTA Line 484

The hearing is being held in conformance with federal public hearing requirements outlined in Section 5307 (d) 1 of Title 49 U.S.C., and public hearing guidelines adopted by the MTA's Board of Directors in 1993, as amended.

The affected bus lines and service proposals under consideration are listed below. Adjustments to these services are recommended for implementation because they carry few passengers and require a high public subsidy to operate. Other changes are proposed to improve transit travel time through the addition of new limited stop service.
