# The Orange Line continues to be a great success!

- Ridership remains high.
  - Average daily ridership in November was 16,400
  - Average daily ridership in December was 15,500
  - Early rider-ship trends for January continue to be very strong
- Passenger feedback is positive.
- Accidents per 100,000 miles are decreasing.



- The Interagency Safety Task Force continues to meet, evaluate and implement recommended changes.
- Completed items include:
- ✓ Intersection speed reduction
- ✓ Lowered "No Right Turn" signs
- ✓ Increased Law Enforcement

- ✓ Installed "Bus Xing" and "Look Both Ways" signs
- ✓ Replaced PV signal indicator with LED "Bus" signs
- ✓ Pavement markings



- The Interagency Safety Task Force continues implementing the following items:
  - ➤ Intersection Photo enforcement
  - LED "Bus" signs for all North/South intersections and Pedestrian crossings
  - Additional pavement markings

- Orange Line specific Safety and PSA DVD production
- **→** Operator Retraining
- Bus Strobe lights
- Bus speed and signal coordination




- The Interagency Safety Task Force continues to review and evaluate the following items:

- Crossing Gates




#### **Orange Line Near Miss Reports**
