SERVICE CHANGE DISCUSSION

- Document Sector Council role during public meeting process to address issues of public safety– pg. 28
- Create appendix detailing actions that can be taken to mitigate impacts to transit dependent riders– Appendix E

IMAPCT ANALYSIS

- Process required by prior Consent Decree ruling, determines if overall program provides benefit to riders.
- Methodology developed as part of the September 2005 policy amendment
- Latest rulings required adjustments to the methodology when fare impacts or for preexisting alternative service that was not being upgraded—

METRO RAPID WARRANTS

- Incorporate final order as it relates to:
 - minimum span and frequency of service
 - exception provisions for span and frequency
 - reallocation limits when initiating new Rapids
- Bus stop guidelines (Appendix A)

OTHER CHANGES

- Modified policy for substandard performing lines that are covered by a subsidy agreement with another entity (pg. 19)
- Added charter bus policy (pg. 16) and rail productivity guidelines (pg. 24)
- Included route numbering and classification system (Appendix G)
