- ACTION: AUTHORIZE THE CEO TO ISSUE A NOTICE-TO-PROCEED FOR CONSTRUCTION PACKAGE A1(a) STREET CORRIDOR IMPROVEMENTS WITH FCI/FLUOR/PARSONS (FFP), A JOINT VENTURE

RECOMMENDATION

- 1. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) to issue a Notice-to-Proceed for Construction Package A1(a) for Street Corridor Improvements in a lump sum amount of \$10,024,626.00; and
- 2. Authorize a construction contingency of \$493,830.00 or 5% of the direct costs, for a total authorization of \$10,518,456.

SUMMARY

The first construction package consists of corridor improvements including sidewalk, street, utilities, and associated elements between Washington and 23rd Streets along Flower Street. The work from Washington Street north to 18th Street (shared trackage with the Metro Blue Line) will be negotiated and accomplished at a later date in order to minimize impact to the Blue Line. Certain items such as storm sewer and traffic signals and lighting will extend further south along Flower Street.

The Authority and the Contractor have conducted negotiations and reached a mutually satisfactory cost for the work.

DISCUSSION

FFP has organized the project into nineteen (19) separate work packages which will be developed to 100% design and awarded, subject to satisfactory negotiation. The first is Construction Package A1(a), 18th to 23rd Street Corridor Improvements. This construction package includes, but is not limited to, utilities, sidewalk, curb and gutter, street cross section, sidewalks, trackways, traffic signals and lighting, and palm tree relocations. Certain items such as storm sewer, traffic signals and lighting will extend further south along Flower Street.

The Contractor prepared a detailed cost estimate addressing quantities, unit prices, production rates, and other cost elements. The Authority prepared its own independent estimate. The Authority and the Contractor then met to attempt to resolve scope and cost differences and arrive at a mutually acceptable cost.

The Contractor's initial proposal was \$13,392,545. The Authority's initial fair cost estimate was \$10,433,079. After several negotiating sessions where the scope of work was clarified and differences in the estimates were resolved, it was agreed that a fair cost for the subject construction package was \$10,518,456, including a 5% contingency on direct costs. The Summary of Negotiations is shown in Attachment A.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

Funds for the proposed action are available from the FY07 budget category, Design/Build Contract, including the contingency amount recommendation contained herein.

NEXT STEPS

If this action is approved by the Board, the CEO will issue a Notice-to-Proceed to FFP. FFP will submit various prerequisite documents, plans, and permit applications per contract and Authority requirements. Separate pre-construction meetings will be held for area residents in the evening and businesses during the day. Construction will commence thereafter.
