 - mostly starting in 2009
- Competitive process cities, county and public transportation agencies eligible to apply
- Funds awarded to projects based on regional significance, need, and mobility benefit

New Program Requirements

- Highway projects not funded through Call
- FY 08 or FY 09 Supplemental Funding Call application
- Non-Disclosure Agreement for Metro data
- Project Study Report and PSR Equivalent Requirements
- Federal and State funds are majority of available funding
- Goods movement projects
- SAFETEA-LU projects are eligible
 - Earmarks cannot be used as local match



New Program Requirements (cont'd)

- Projects benefiting transit oriented development are awarded additional points
- Local match is a requirement
 - 20% must be must be monetary
 - Overmatch eligible for up to 10 points
 - Monies spent on environmental documentation preparation and preliminary engineering within 3 years prior to Board adoption can be used toward the monetary 20% local match

Funding Overview

- Fund estimates under development
 - Amount of uncommitted funds is being determined through the LRTP process
 - Projected revenues from 2008 STIP (RIP & TEA)
 - Federal funding mostly CMAQ, RSTP
 - Local funds limited and only Prop. C 25%
- Fund estimates adopted in Spring 2007

STIP: State Transportation Improvement Program

RIP: Regional Improvement Program

TEA: Transportation Enhancement Activities

CMAQ: Congestion Mitigation & Air Quality Improvement Program

Funding for RSTI/Goods Movement may be less than full range shown, depending on availability of Regional Surface Transportation Program and State Transportation Improvement Program funds.



Freeway projects will be implemented in accordance with Board adopted priorities rather than through the Call for Projects application process. Most State Highway projects are funded through the Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) and are not included in the Call for Projects funding estimates.
