Terri Slimmer has worked in the transportation and transit arena for nearly 30 years – 28 in the public sector and two (2) in the private sector. She is currently the Transportation Manager for the City of West Hollywood and oversees, coordinates and manages various City functions, including: transportation, traffic and planning operations; traffic control center operations; coordinating programs with various jurisdictions; and regulation of taxicab operations, neighborhood traffic calming projects, red light photo enforcement and transportation review (CEQA and non-CEQA) of development projects.
