North Region Contract Award

- Contract Awarded to: Veolia Transportation
- Contract term: five years
- Amount: not-to-exceed \$64,330,054
- Payment: hourly rate for actual revenue service hours operated, less fare revenues
- Fuel costs: to be reimbursed separately on a monthly basis
- Other: additional liquidated damages for failure to meet standards



North Region Contract Procurement Process

- Utilized Best Value-Explicit Factors procurement method
- Included older buses in the current fleet due for retirement, which required two hourly rates
- Ensured vendor proposals were technically responsive and included:
 - site visits to confirm operational functionality
 - oral interviews to verify experience of proposed management team
 - reference checks to substantiate successful past performance



North Region Contract Procurement Process

RFP Evaluation-

The evaluation criteria for this procurement was weighted as follows:

• Price	35 %
 Operating methodology/workplan 	20%
 Past Performance 	15%
 Qualifications of the firm 	10%
 Qualifications of the staff 	10%
• Compliance with California Labor Code	10%



Veolia Transportation – Company Background

- Company founded in 1935; named Veolia Transportation in 2005 after a series of mergers and acquisitions
- Operates in 27 countries with 72,000 employees
- Also operates taxi, rail and paratransit systems throughout Europe and North America



Veolia Transportation – Proposal Strengths

- Detailed facility/site plan and a thorough permitting and construction schedule for their facility
- Knowledge of the maintenance issues involved in the existing fleet
- Complied with California Labor Code 1070-1074 and a retention bonus for all operators and mechanics working for the present contractor
- Committed to 10.75% on their Disadvantaged Enterprise Anticipated Level of Participation (DALP)



Veolia Transportation - Service Start-up

- Meet with both outgoing and incoming operators on transition arrangements to take place upon Board approval
- Prepare to begin construction of their new facility just north of downtown
- Hire and conduct bus operator training to start in early summer
- Begin service on August 3, 2008
