- Initiated in 2005
- Developed in Partnership with Multiple Agencies
- Built on Previous Efforts
- Developed as a Master Plan for Southern California
- Regional in Scope
- Respected and Recognized Agency Roles & Authorities
- Involved Substantial Stakeholder Outreach
- Identified Over \$50 Billion in Improvements and Mitigation Measures (of which more than a half have been identified in Los Angeles County)


