

New Metro Service Plan

• The new race course routing will NOT require the complex Bus-Rail interface and staffing plan used in 2007 and 2008.





Service Changes - Bus

Metro Bus Lines will be detoured away from the race course:

- Beginning at 4:00am
- Detours will be canceled as the race progresses Staff support required:
- 50 Vehicle Operations Supervisors will be assigned to the field to assist with the bus detour operations
- 2-4 Bus Operations Control Supervisors required for the increased volume of radio calls
- 4-6 Field Equipment Technicians will be deployed at key locations to address equipment issues
- 6 Vehicle Operations Supervisors will post detours on all affected bus stops for 4 days prior to the event



Bus Support Services Required

Staff:

- 50 Vehicle Operations Supervisors will be assigned to the field to assist with the bus detour operations most on overtime
- 2-4 Bus Operations Control Supervisors required for the increased volume of radio calls most on overtime
- 4-6 Field Equipment Technicians will be deployed at key locations to address equipment issues most on overtime
- 6 Vehicle Operations Supervisors will post detours on all affected bus stops for 4 days prior to the event

Equipment:

- 25 additional pool vehicles required for field support
- 2 buses and Operators provided to LAFD for emergency use / cool down at the finish line
- Additional bus mileage, as all reliefs are made with buses, due to traffic and detour delays throughout the day



Bus Support Services Required

Miscellaneous:

- Print and Copy 2,000 detour notices, 1,000 signs, 75,000 Service Change Notices (distributed to our passengers), bus division display materials (maps, instructions, etc.)
- Transit Operations Supervisor time spent on planning, meetings, detour notice preparation, communications, etc.
- Increased unscheduled overtime at all bus divisions



Service Changes - Rail

To accommodate regular passengers, runners, bicyclists and spectators:

- One additional trip per hour provided on the Red, Purple,
 Gold and Blue Lines between 6:30am and 9:30am
- One additional car added to Blue Line trains between
 6:00am and 10:00am
- One additional car added to Gold Line trains between
 6:00am and 10:00am
- Two additional cars added to Purple Line trains prior to 9:00am



Rail Support Services Required

Staff:

- 1 Rail Transit Operations Supervisor will be assigned to the field to assist with monitoring the rail operations
- 1 additional Train Operator for the Purple Line
- 1 additional Train Operator for the Blue Line

Equipment:

- 8 additional Purple Line cars for three hours
- 14 additional Blue Line cars for three hours
- 4 additional Gold Line cars for three hours



Customer Service

- A small number (6-8) of Customer Information Agents will be stationed at key locations to assist with the routing of passengers
- Detour changes will be posted at bus stops prior to the event
- Information on detours available on website
