Dear Assembly Members Bass and Perez:

On behalf of the organizations in the Education Coalition, we are writing to alert you to our very strong concerns about a legislative package that reportedly is under development. According to a recent article in <u>Capitol Weekly</u>, "legislative democrats" are working on a plan that would replace revenues from the sales tax on gasoline with revenues from an excise tax on gasoline. The article specifically notes that this shift would reduce State General Fund revenues and therefore reduce the Proposition 98 funding for school districts and community colleges.

From an education perspective, such a proposal would mimic the Governor's proposal to manipulate revenues in order to make more cuts to public education. We will vigorously oppose any such proposal that fails to protect education from more cuts.

The fact is that the vast majority of the current state budget problems result from past budget "solutions" that the state has been unable to implement. In contrast, the cuts to schools approved by the Legislature and the Governor have been made. Schools have already suffered \$17 billion in cuts through past budget actions. It is not fair and it is not right to redefine revenues in order to allow deeper cuts to public education. We urge you to protect education funding in any legislative package that is developed to resolve the issue of transit funding.
