Metro Freeway Service Patrol Celebrates 25 Years

On Wednesday, Metro Chair and City of Duarte Councilmember John Fasana joined California Highway Patrol Southern Division Assistant Chief Gregory Peck, Caltrans Deputy District Director for Operations Ali Zaghari, Metro Deputy CEO Stephanie Wiggins and Metro's Freeway Service Patrol staff in celebrating 25 years of Metro's Freeway Service Patrol (FSP). The FSP began as a test program in 1991 and has since helped more than seven million motorists — and remains a free service provided by LA Metro and Caltrans with oversight by the California Highway Patrol (CHP).

FSP service is provided by independent tow service operators contracted with Metro and covers 475 freeway miles of LA County during commute hours seven days per week. The average wait time for FSP is just seven minutes. FSP drivers change flat tires, jump start dead batteries, refill radiators, repair leaking hoses, provide up to one gallon of fuel and can tow a disabled vehicle out of freeway lanes - all work very crucial to Metro's commitment to reducing traffic and keeping LA County moving.

OEI's Debut Newsletter Highlights Unsolicited Proposal Policy

Earlier this week, the Office of Extraordinary Innovation (OEI) shared their debut newsletter with the agency, available here for viewing. The newsletter included an open letter to Metro employees laying out OEI's vision and role in the agency. It also included what will be a monthly feature spotlighting the many innovations that are happening around Metro.

Another major topic was the advent of Metro's new Unsolicited Proposals Policy. This policy, designed to open Metro's doors to new ideas, would not be possible without you. Fifty-seven staff members from all over Metro have contributed to reviewing the 32 Unsolicited Proposals we've received to date - about one a week. Seeing how many Metro staff have come together to explore new ideas is quite inspiring.

Of the 18 Phase I reviews completed, six proposals have advanced to Phase II or are in the process of advancing, and two were spun-off into partnerships. This new catalyst of innovation simply could not happen without the assistance and expertise of Metro staff – some of the best transportation employees in the country. Your insights have been critical, and Metro will continue to need your support to implement the best ideas in transportation at Metro.

I would like to thank the many Metro staff reviewers who have contributed to testing new ideas and evaluating proposals so far.

Discussing Transit Projects with Metro Magazine and KCRW

On Monday, I spoke with two media outlets and took questions regarding transportation projects and topics related to Los Angeles County and Metro's Plan to Ease Traffic. I was interviewed by Metro Magazine on a range of transportation topics including, ridership gains on the recently opened Expo Line to Santa Monica, goals for Metro's Office of Extraordinary Innovation, and new projects on the horizon. A piece by Metro Magazine is expected to run in advance of the APTA Annual Conference in Los Angeles September 11 – 14, 2016.

Later that afternoon, I provided a general overview of transportation projects within the Los Angeles County Traffic Improvement Plan for KCRW reporter/producer Saul Gonzales. I reported that the Metro Board of Directors have approved placing a sales tax ballot measure -- now officially known as Measure M -- on the November 2016 ballot. If approved by voters, a new half-cent sales tax would go into effect in 2017, generating an estimated \$860 million per year. When the existing Measure R half-cent sales tax expires in 2039, this new tax measure will increase to one cent and would not expire until voters decide to end it. Stories examining Measure M are expected to run on Morning Edition and All Things Considered in the November timeframe.

C/LAX Staff Assist in Providing Meals for Families in Need

This past weekend, Metro Crenshaw/LAX (C/LAX) Transit Project staff including project Director, Charles Beauvoir, helped make over 500 lunches for families and individuals in need. Over 75 people responded to the call for volunteers. Crenshaw Buffalo Wild Wings hosted the event and volunteers received Metro *Eat, Shop, Play* gift bags and t-shirts. FY17 Adopted Budget

The adopted budget for Fiscal Year 2017 (FY17) has been officially released and posted to the Metro website. At \$5.6 billion, the FY17 budget is balanced and represents a three percent decrease from the FY16 budget, proving that recent agency wide efforts to control costs have been successful. As we build new rail lines, expand services and enhance service quality, we must also continue to emphasize the importance of tightened financial controls in an ongoing effort to achieve long term financial stability.

Metro Fitness Center Operator (IFB)

Metro will release an Invitation for Bid (IFB) to procure management services for the Metro Fitness Center and adjacent facilities.

This procurement is for one hundred and ten (110) Hybrid Mid-Size Sedan Vehicles to replace existing

vehicles in the current fleet to support bus and rail operations.
