LAW ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITY

The Transit Police Dispatch Center received approximately 1,665 "Calls for Service" for the time period of March 1st to March 31st 1995. Approximately 318 of the 1,665 Transit Police dispatch calls resulted in a Preliminary Investigative Report categorized into the following offenses:



Approximately **200 (63%)** of the **318** Police Investigation Reports resulted in an arrest, cite and release, and or the temporary detention and release of an adult or juvenile subject.

70 of the total arrests were for **Misdemeanor Offenses**. *

40 of the total arrests were for **Felony Offenses**. *

75 were **Cite and Release** violations.


06 were **detained and released** for medical examination or observation.

Attached is the March 1995 Metro Blue Line Law Enforcement Activities Report. A summary of significant data and trends follows:

CITATIONS ISSUED

A total of 1,624 citations were issued during the month of March. This totals 5 less citations, from February's total.

Officers issued 765 fare-related citations; this represents 47.11% of the monthly total.

A total of 1,221 passengers were given fare warnings.

Detailed citation information is outlined on pages 4, 5 and 6.

FARE ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITY

Approximately 363,576 passengers were inspected for proper payment of fare. This represents 33.86% of the estimated 1,073,920 passengers during the month of March.

ARRESTS

A total of 47 misdemeanor and 16 felony arrests were made during the month of March.

Of the 63 arrestees, 55 were adults and 8 juveniles.

Pages 1 and 2 of the report provides detailed arrest information.

REPORTED CRIMES

A total of 28 crimes (**13 Part I Crimes**) were reported during the month of March, this represents a decrease of 9.68% from February's total.

Of the 28 reported crimes, 24 (85.71%) occurred "on rail property," 3 (10.71%) "adjacent to rails," and 1 (3.57%) "away from the rail."

Reported crime information is provided on page 3.

VANDALISM

A total of 3 incidents of vandalism were reported for the month of March.



ARRESTS BY AREA MARCH 1995









Total Vehicle Code Citations for Month = 518




BY TIME OF DAY



Total Penal Code Citations for Month = 1,106




BY TIME OF DAY
