

REPORTED CRIMES BY LOCATION AND BUS PATROL AREAS







Attached is the April 1995 Metro Blue Line Law Enforcement Activities Report. A summary of significant data and trends follows:

CITATIONS ISSUED

A total of 1,567 citations were issued during the month of April. This totals 57 less citations, for a 3.51% decrease from March's total.

Officers issued 645 fare-related citations; this represents 41.16% of the monthly total.

A total of 1,135 passengers were given fare warnings.

Detailed citation information is outlined on pages 4, 5 and 6.

FARE ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITY

Approximately 348,792 passengers were inspected for proper payment of fare. This represents 32.87% of the estimated 1,061,000 passengers during the month of April.

ARRESTS

A total of 48 misdemeanor and 18 felony arrests were made during the month of April.

Of the 66 arrestees, 56 were adults and 10 juveniles.

Pages 1 and 2 of the report provides detailed arrest information.

REPORTED CRIMES

A total of 14 crimes (**6 Part I Crimes**) were reported during the month of April, this represents a decrease of 50% from March's total.

Of the 14 reported crimes, 11 (78.57%) occurred "on rail property," 2 (14.29%) "adjacent to rails," and 1 (7.14%) "away from the rail."

Reported crime information is provided on page 3.

VANDALISM

A total of 6 incidents of vandalism were reported for the month of April.

Specific vandalism information can be found on page 10.



ARRESTS BY AREA APRIL 1995







Total Vehicle Code Citations for Month = 576




BY TIME OF DAY



Total Penal Code Citations for Month = 991




BY TIME OF DAY

CITATIONS ISSUED

Due to the legislative changes in the 640 Penal Code Section, citation information will be unavailable until M.I.S. updates our in-house computer database system of those changes; the database provides automated citation information which is needed for this report.

As of May 16, 1995, database system has not been updated.

FARE ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITY

Approximately 145,281 passengers were inspected for proper payment of fare. This represents 31.11% of the estimated 467,000 passengers during the month of April.

A total of 626 passengers were given fare warnings.

ARRESTS

A total of 12 misdemeanor and 6 felony arrests were made during the month of April. Of the 18 arrestees, 17 were adults and 1 juvenile.

REPORTED CRIMES

A total of 4 crimes (including **two Part I Crimes**) were reported for the month of April; this represents an increase of 33% from March's total.


