



**REPORTED CRIMES BY LOCATION AND BUS PATROL AREAS**







Attached is the May 1995 Metro Blue Line Activities Report. A summary of significant data and trends follows:

**CITATIONS ISSUED**

A total of 1,511 citations were issued during the month of May. This totals 56 less citations, for a 3.57% decrease from April's total. Officers issued 641 fare-related citations; this represents 42.42% of the monthly total. A total of 1,056 passengers were given fare warnings. Detailed citation information is outlined on pages 4, 5 and 6.

**FARE ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITY**

Approximately 338,982 passengers were inspected for proper payment of fare. This represents 30.58% of the estimated 1,108,650 passengers during the month of May.

**ARRESTS**

A total of 36 misdemeanor and 12 felony arrests were made during the month of May. Of the 48 arrestees, 44 were adults and 4 juveniles. Pages 1 and 2 provides detailed arrest information.

**REPORTED CRIMES**

A total of 13 crimes (**8 Part I Crimes**) were reported during the month of May; this represents a decrease of 7.14% from April's total. Of the 13 reported crimes, all occurred "on rail property." Reported crime information is provided on page 3.

**VANDALISM**

A total of 3 incidents of vandalism were reported for the month of May. Specific vandalism information can be found on page 10.










# MAY 1995

Total Vehicle Code Citations for Month = 560





**Total Penal Code Citations for Month = 951**





A total of 513 passengers were given fare warnings.


**ARRESTS**


