QUALITY COMMUNITY SERVICE

Detective Squad Meetings

Sergeant Bruce Vermaat, Pickpocket Detail (PPD) OIC, attended Wilshire, Hollenbeck, Foothill, Devonshire, West Los Angeles and Pacific Divisions Detective Squad meetings and gave presentations on the functions and goals of the Pickpocket Detail. Information was disseminated on grand theft person and lost property reports occurring on the LACMTA bus lines.

Officers Carlos DeLaCruz and Romik Keshishi appeared at a Rampart Area Basic Car Community Meeting at the request of SLO Victor Gutierrez. The officers made a presentation regarding TBD and its functions to a group of thirty community members. Officer Gutierrez subsequently commended the officers for their appearance and their presentation, which included ways of directing concerns to the LACMTA.

Pickpocket Detail Identifies North Hollywood Sexual Predator

In early April, Officers Chang Kim, Maggie Sherman, Mark Preciado and Malcolm Thomas received information from Sergeant Jim Allen of a sexual predator operating on LACMTA buses in the North Hollywood area. Officers immediately conducted a follow-up investigation to assist North Hollywood Detectives identify the predator. Over the next month and a half the officers used their surveillance experience to identify the sexual predator. The officers were able to follow the suspect to his residence, obtain photographs, determine his occupation and complete a field interview card. The officers completed a follow-up investigation with the information obtained. The photographs and field interview card were handed over to Detective III Cobos, of the MAC table.

On June 14, Detective Cobos phoned Officers Kim and Sherman to advise them that she had presented the case to the District Attorney for filing. As a result of the information gathered by the Pickpocket Detail the District Attorney filed one count of stalking, one count of sexual battery and one count of child annoying. A warrant was issued for the suspect's arrest.

Nishi-Nippon Railroad Visits TBD

On June 23, representatives from the Nishi-Nippon Railroad Co., from Japan visited the LACMTA. As part of their visit, they requested a briefing from LAPD on how security functions as it pertains to policing the public transportation systems. Lieutenant Michael Brooks provided an overview of TBD's mission and operating procedures. Visitors were also given a tour of the police facilities and a demonstration of police response to an SAS alarm.

TCT Transit Services

On June 7 Sergeant Joseph Rauchfuss, GHOST, OIC, met with Mr. Simon Herrera, Transit Operations Manger, TCT Transit Services. The on-going vandalism problem with the students that attend Jefferson High School was discussed. Sergeant Rauchfuss initiated and explained the Law Enforcement Service Request Forms with Mr. Herrera. Mr. Herrera was assured GHOST would closely monitor the activity on the Southeast bus line in the vicinity of Jefferson High School. In addition, GHOST officers will periodically visit TCT Headquarter to pick up the Law Enforcement Service Request Forms to assure immediate enforcement action can be taken.

CRIME

LACMTA Bus Operator Stolen Automobile Recovered

On June 2, Officers Brett Clark and John Hatfield, were patrolling the area of Bonnie Brae and 4th Streets when they observed a gray Ford van headed in their direction of travel. The operator of the vehicle caused his vehicle to skid twice as he sped down the street in violation of 23109 VC Exhibition of Speed. The officers conducted a traffic stop and the suspect (later identified as Miranda, Francisco, age 28) told the officers that the vehicle belonged to his Aunt and that it had bad brakes. Hatfield observed a plastic key protruding from the ignition. A subsequent investigation revealed that the vehicle was stolen just 20 minutes prior to the stop and that it belonged to a LACMTA Bus Operator. The operator responded and retrieved her vehicle from the officers. As a result of their thorough investigation, both suspects admitted to the crime through voluntary statements.

Sexual Predator Arrested

On June 7, Officers Refugio Garza, Lorena Alcaraz and George Oto were working the Western Avenue corridor for sexual predators and pickpocket suspects. Garza and Alcaraz boarded LACMTA bus no. 5178, line 207, traveling northbound on Western Avenue at Third Street. Officers observed a male Hispanic suspect (later identified as Esteilla, Emetelio, age 56) approach two teenage girls seated near the back of the bus. Esteilla grabbed the overhead bars with both hands and rubbed his erect penis against the shoulder area of the female seated in the aisle seat. Officer Alcaraz was in a clear position to observe the crime. The victim and witness exited the bus at the next service stop. Alcaraz interviewed the two teenage girls and confirmed a crime of sexual battery had been committed. Esteilla was arrested without incident for sexual battery. Esteilla confessed to the crime and admitted to Garza that he had committed the same type of acts on prior occasions while riding LACMTA busses.

Disturbing the Peace Arrest

On June 12, Officers Michael Andrew and partner Officer Angelia Downs received a radio call of a 415 man on LACMTA bus no. 2156, line 217. Upon officers arrival they were met by victim LACMTA Bus Operator, Mary Kenney who stated, the suspect (later identified as Chun, Joseph, age 73) boarded the bus Hill Street without paying the full fair. Kenney came to the end of the route (17th/Broadway) when Chun refuse to get off the bus and demanded Kenny drive him to Compton. Officers approached Chun and asked him to exit the bus. Chun refused officers multiple requests to exit the bus and as he verbally harassed and yelled profanities at Kenney and the officers. Officer Andrew placed a firm grip on Chun. Chun initially resisted, Andrews applied more force in order to remove Chun from the seat, Chun was handcuffed and taken into custody for Disturbing Peace without further incident. The use of force was classified as in policy.

Pickpocket Arrest

On June 13, PPD Officers Refugio Garza, Lorena Alcaraz and George Oto were training Officers Rick Ballesteros and Dave Randall from the Pacific Area, Airport Crimes Unit, in recognition and identification of pickpocket suspects. The officers were working the Chinatown Area identified by FASTRAC as a problem area with pickpocket activity. Officers observed and subsequently initiated a surveillance of activities on pickpocket suspect (later identified as Steve Megliorino, age 32). Officer Alcaraz boarded LACMTA bus on Broadway and 3rd, posing as an MTA passenger, sat directly in front of Megliorino with her purse over her shoulder. As the bus traveled Westbound on 3rd Street, Megliorino reached over the seat and removed a wallet from Alcaraz' purse. Megliorino immediately placed the wallet between a folded newspaper under his arm and exited the bus at the next service stop. Megliorino was arrested for Grand Theft Person without incident upon exiting the bus.

During the booking process it was discovered Megliorino, has three prior arrests for 211 PC - Robbery, 487 PC - Grand Theft Person, 245 PC - Assault with a Deadly Weapon, along with 594 PC - Vandalism. As a result of his criminal history, the District Attorney's office has filed a third felony strike against Megliorino. The District Attorney's office stated they would give Megliorino an option of pleading guilty to the recent pickpocket arrest with a minimum sentence of twelve years in state prison. Once again, the Pickpocket Detail has removed a career criminal from the streets making travel for the MTA customers much safer.

Narcotics Arrest

On June 17, Officers Jeffrey Heller and Patrick Aluotto were conducting bus boardings in the area of 5th and Spring Streets. Officers observed a suspect holding two bags of marijuana and examining them. Officers exited the bus and detained Richard Quietie, age 44, who immediately began resisting arrest and fell forward on the sidewalk, freeing himself from one of the officer's grips and destroying one of the bags of marijuana. Officers quickly subdued Quietie and subsequently recovered three rocks of cocaine in one of his pockets. The use of force was classified as "in policy" and there were no resulting injuries.

Lewd Conduct Arrest

On June 20, while riding LACMTA bus No. 6761, Line 28, Eastbound on Olympic Boulevard from Normandie Avenue, Officers Chang Kim and Maggie Sherman observed a male Hispanic (later identified as Fernando Espinoza, age 33) seated towards the back of the bus masturbating. Espinoza exited the bus at 5th Street and Main Streets where he was taken into custody for Lewd Conduct without incident. Espinoza has no prior arrest record.

Sexual Predator Arrest at Segment Three Grand Opening

On June 25, LACMTA Red Line, in its second day of the grand opening for segment three, offered free fare. The trains were extremely busy and presented a great opportunity for sexual predators to commit their crimes. Officers Refugio Garza, Lorena Alcaraz, George Oto and Sergeant Bruce Vermaat were working the Pickpocket Detail in an undercover capacity. Officers observed a male Hispanic, (later identified as Ernesto Limon, age 40) paying close attention to numerous females as they boarded the train. Limon subsequently positioned himself directly behind a female adult. Limon immediately placed his left hand down the front of his pants and adjusted his penis. When he removed his hand, he rubbed his groin area and hands against the buttocks of the female victim. Limon quickly exited the train when it made a service-stop at the North Hollywood station and was subsequently taken into custody for Sexual Battery, without incident, by uniform officers.

TRAINING

Police/Transit Relations Training

During the month of June the below listed subjects were presented to approximately 181 MTA Operators and Supervisors who attended the Police and Transit Relations course during their yearly qualification or new employee courses.

The curriculum consisted of the following subjects:

- Communications: Alternatives to MTA communications, providing a good suspect descriptions, which crimes need to be reported immediately, and how operators can reset their Silent Alarm System. (During false activations)
- Police / Sheriff Tactics: How calls for service will be handled. Average response times, Low Risk vs. High-Risk stops, and the S.L.O.W. acronym (operator responsibilities).
- Additional Knowledge: Types of crimes (Felonies, Misdemeanors, and Infractions). Procedures for private persons arrest, Initiating Law Enforcement Service Requests, Bus Boarding, and Undercover units available for MTA service.

Upon completion of the course presentation, a test package and class critique is given to each class participant. On average, two questions are missed on the test. Numerous positive comments have been received via the training.

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

Lakers Victory – Tactical Alert

On June 19, PM Watch personnel were held over on a Tactical Alert due to the post event activities of the final Lakers game. Because of unruly fans and others, the officers were organized into a squad that attempted to respond to the needs of buses reporting unusual activity in the downtown area. The officers, under the direct supervision of AM Watch Sergeants Teri Churchill and Kevin Scroggins responded to several incidents involving bus calls and requests for assistance by other officers. PM Watch personnel were active in their efforts until they were relieved at 0300 hours in the morning.

Metro Red Line Segment Three Grand Opening

On June 23-25, TBD Officers were assigned to assist Transit Rail Division with the Grand Opening of Segment 3, Metro Red Line. Coinciding with the opening was the inauguration of the Rapid Bus Service (RBS) along the Whittier-Wilshire Corridor and the Ventura Boulevard Corridor. Special Details of PM Watch Personnel began extensive bus ridings and boardings along those two corridors to acquaint new passengers with the Los Angeles Police Department and the Transit Bus Division service as provided to the MTA. The buses along both lines were packed with riders during those inaugural runs, perhaps because the rides were free during that period. The Buses feature limited stops and faster access from outlying areas to the respective Metro Red Line Stations where the lines end.

PILOT PROGRAM/TASK FORCE

Miracle on Broadway

The downtown foot beats were reduced from two to one due to the continued training days for Rapid Bus Deployment, Tabletop Exercises and Field Exercises in preparation of the Democratic National Convention. Beginning DP 7, 2000, the foot beats will be cancelled due to the training and the activities associated with the Democratic National Convention. The foot beats will resume in September.

Bandit Van Task Force

During the month of June, Transit Bus Division personnel continued to respond to bus operators' concerns and information on bandit van activity. Uniform officers continued operating in the Rampart Area. The combined mission focused on enforcement of Vehicle Code, Los Angeles Municipal Code, and Penal Code sections. Officers issued six citations for various infractions. The activity has greatly decreased in the targeted areas; however, the task forces will continue on a monthly basis to prevent the activity from returning.

Graffiti Pilot Task Force Operates Line 16 Servicing Belmont High School

It is the goal of Transit Bus Division to reduce the approximate \$15 million dollars a year lost by the LACMTA to graffiti vandalism repairs. One of many strategies to achieve this goal is to increase the number arrests made using bus camera evidence. For a three-week period, consisting of six days total, approximately 19 plainclothes officers were assigned to Line 16. During the after school hours, officers implemented a three-phase game plan that required the assistance of Maintenance personnel at LACMTA Divisions 1 and 7. The aforementioned divisions supplied graffiti free buses with cameras during the operation. The officer's primary function was to identify and apprehend graffiti vandal(s) on bus runs 8, 68, 71, and 80, servicing Belmont High School. A secondary function was to interrupt the commission of other crimes or offenses involving students as victims or suspects. The three phases utilized are described as follows:

Phase One- Required officers to conduct pre and post inspections on bus runs 8, 68, 71 and 80 for graffiti vandalism. All vandalism identified during the post inspection was documented on a crime report. The Special Enforcement Section (SES) within GHOST handles the follow-up investigation. The videotape hard drives were removed and viewed by SES on those buses identified with new graffiti.

*Phase Two-*GHOST officers were required to board buses with students at bus stops servicing Belmont High School along the 3rd Street corridor. The officers arrested or cited anyone who committed a crime or violation on the bus or at the bus stop.

*Phase Three-*Same as Phase One. To evaluate the effectiveness the operation had on reducing graffiti vandalism.

During the six-day operation, officers made three misdemeanor arrests for vandalism crimes that occurred either on the bus or at a bus stop. In addition, two bus videotapes were removed for viewing and additional arrests are anticipated. A total of nine bus boardings were made totaling 11 hours. During the period of May 22 to June 20, 2000, 21 bus boardings were made totaling 15 hours. The GHOST unit will continue to closely monitor the problem.
