It has been our pleasure to serve you since October first.

Perhaps some of you didn't realize there had been any change, because busses, uniforms, colors of paint, etc., have temporarily remained

as they were before the property transfer.

Nevertheless, progress is already being made in carrying out \$15 million worth of changes planned for the next five years.

Five hundred new coaches with "air suspension" instead of the old-type metal springs will take \$12 million of this investment. Shipment of 30 of these coaches, costing \$23,000 each, has already started, and 100 more are due soon after the first of the year.

Nearly three million dollars will be spent to provide better garage and terminal facilities at eight major locations over the system. This work is already under way.
