General Managers Armijo and Gabig Now Responsible for Operating Divisions

(March 1, 2002) David Armijo and Jack Gabig, the first of the new service sector general managers to begin work at the MTA, have assumed interim responsibility for the 11 operating divisions, Deputy CEO John Catoe has announced.

Armijo will oversee operations in the West/Central and South Bay service sectors – divisions 5, 6, 7, 10 and 18 – while Gabig will supervise the San Gabriel Valley, San Fernando Valley and Gateway sectors – divisions 1, 2, 3, 8, 9 and 15.

Richard Rogers, who currently serves as vice president of Transportation Concepts, is due to join the MTA in April. Gerald Francis, general manager for Rail Operations, joined the agency in January.

Final service sector assignments for the three new general managers have not yet been announced. The San Gabriel and San Fernando valley sectors are scheduled to open July 1.

In addition to directing activities at his five divisions, Armijo will be responsible for the Bus Operations Control Center and for Operations Central Instruction. He also will work with division staffs to improve bus operations on-time performance.

Armijo and Gabig are visiting each of the operating divisions to evaluate the condition of the facilities and to determine short- and long-term needs in bringing them up to current standards.

The new general managers will work with the Service Sector Task Force to implement a staffing plan for the sectors. They also are participating in the budget process for FY-2003.
