

Division 10's Evelyn Frizielle Retiring after Unusual Career at MTA

(March 28, 2002) Gateway Division 10 Transportation Manager Evelyn Frizielle – the first employee to hold that position who had not started as a bus operator – will retire, Friday, after 27 years at the MTA.

Frizielle started in the MTA's marketing department in 1975 as a Customer Information representative. She then went into SCRTD's the management training program for a year before working as a Personnel Analyst in the Human Resources Department.

After five years in Human Resources, Frizielle transferred to the Transit Operations Department as a senior staff assistant and became assistant division manager within a year. About six years later, she was named division transportation manager.

"I think the MTA is a terrific organization to work for," says Frizielle. "It's been a very worthwhile experience. I hate to leave all the people I met over the years. I made a lot of friends."

Frizielle plans to spend more time with her two sisters and brother, who live in three separate states. And like a school kid on summer vacation, she also plans to "play."
