4 Life Terms for Man Convicted in Union Station Sexual Assaults

(June 22, 2005) A Carson man accused of two sexual assaults and an attempted assault on women at Union Station in 2004 was sentenced, June 17, to four life terms in prison.

Stephen Jackson was convicted on 11 felony counts that included rape, sodomy and attempted rape involving two victims at the Central Library and three at Union Station. The women, who were assaulted between March and September, 2004, ranged in age from 17 to 25.

Jackson, 34, will be eligible for parole for in 81 years. He was convicted of the crimes, May 24, in Los Angeles County Superior Court.

Jackson was arrested outside Metro Headquarters, Sept. 2, 2004, when one of the victims pointed him out to Sheriff's deputies. In addition to identification by all the victims, Jackson was linked to one case by a DNA match.
