## Final Commencement: Graduation Ends 25 Years of Tuition for Metro Family

(June 23, 2005) As "Pomp and Circumstance" played at the University of LaVerne, Metro Bus Operator Bacilio Cortez and his wife, Olga, stood proud for more than their youngest daughter's commencement.

The graduation marked the end of more than 25 years of tuition payments for their four children.
