Officials to Review State Infrastructure Proposal at Mobility 21 Coalition Meeting Friday

(Feb. 9, 2006) Caltrans District 7 Director Douglas R. Failing and U.S. Congressman Earl Blumenauer of Oregon are among those scheduled to attend the next Mobility 21 Coalition meeting on Friday, Feb. 10.

Topic of discussion for the meeting will be Gov. Arnold Schwarzenegger's \$222 billion infrastructure proposal that includes road, highway and rail improvements earmarked for Los Angeles and Orange counties.

The Feb. 10 meeting is set for 9 a.m. to 11:30 a.m., in the 1st floor conference room of the Caltrans District 7 Administration Building, 100 S. Main St., Los Angeles. Registration will begin at 8:30 a.m.

The initiative is being led by Metro and the Los Angeles Area Chamber of Commerce in partnership with the Automobile Club of Southern California. The coalition has been actively advocating at the state and federal level on vital transportation issues including funding.
