MTA, METROLINK TO OFFICIALLY DEDICATE NORTHRIDGE METROLINK STATION WITH COUNTRY/WESTERN CARNIVAL SATURDAY, NOV. 19

The Northridge Metrolink station, which was pressed into early service in January because of the Northridge earthquake, will be officially dedicated Saturday, Nov. 19, with a public ceremony and country/western carnival.

Free Metrolink rides to the Northridge station will begin at 10:45 a.m. from the Chatsworth station and at 11:46 a.m. from the Van Nuys station. There will be four free trains available in each direction during the carnival, traveling approximately every hour.

Festivities will begin at 11 a.m. MTA Board Member Mel Wilson and Los Angeles City Councilman Hal Bernson, representing Metrolink, will be featured speakers.

Following the ribbon-cutting ceremony, the public is invited to participate in the country/western carnival, which will feature games, music and hayrides for the entire family. The carnival will end at 2 p.m. Parking for the event is available at the Chatsworth station, with limited parking at the Van Nuys and Northridge stations.

The Northridge station is located at 8775 Wilbur Avenue in Northridge.
