Mayor Richard Riordan, MTA and other officials will hold a groundbreaking for a new \$2 million bike bridge to span the Los Angeles River in the Los Feliz area. The bridge, funded jointly by MTA and the City of Los Angeles, will be named after long-time cycling enthusiast Alex Baum who has fought for more bikeways in the city and region for more than 25 years. Baum will be on hand for interviews.

Join actors Ed Begley Jr., Joe Spano ("Hill Street Blues"), Alexandra Paul ("Baywatch") and an expected 2,000 other bicyclists on the first annual Los Angeles River Ride, sponsored by the Los Angeles County Bicycle Coalition. The ride will begin from the Autry Museum of Western Heritage, 4700 Western Heritage Way in Griffith Park. NOTE: Various short and long rides for families and as well as serious cyclists will be available in different categories: 2K for younger cyclist and beginner cyclist. All ages from 2 years old and up; 40K Great ride for families and intermediate cyclist who will ride along the LA River Center and Gardens and back to the Museum. 100K This ride will go from the Museum to downtown Long Beach Bike Station and back to the starting point along the L.A. River. The MTA will provide free rides for cyclists choosing to ride back to Union Station. All event participants are required to wear bicycle helmets that are ANSI or Snell approved. The Los Angeles River is not a race.
