SOUTH CENTRAL L.A. COMES ALIVE WITH COLORFUL HIDE-N-SEEK SCULPTURES INSTALLED AT MTA WILMINGTON/IMPERIAL STATION

WHAT: Nationally-renowned artist JoeSam. will make a special appearance at the Wilmington/Imperial Station to chat about the installation of his spirited sculptures among the 58 freeway supporting columns at the intersection of the Metro Blue and Green Lines. Called "Hide n' Seek," the sculpture captures the heart and soul of children, who make up more than one half the population of South Central Los Angeles.

The sculptures, which are in the process of being installed, were created as part of MTA's A-R-T program, which commissions local artists to create public works of art for MTA bus and rail facilities.
