MTA DEDICATES ITS NEWEST PUBLIC ART WORK AT CHATSWORTH METROLINK STATION

WHAT: "Mountain Passage," a work created by artist John Okulick, will be dedicated. The 15-foot tall structure serves as a gateway to welcome visitors to Chatsworth, and as a visual connection between the community and the station, a recreation of Chatsworth's original 19th century train depot. It depicts the Santa Susannah Mountains, and Metrolink arrow symbol below the number 1888, which marks the year Chatsworth was first settled. Okulick has been commissioned as an artist for several major public art projects around the country, including the Ronald Reagan State Building in downtown Los Angeles. Funding for the station project was provided equally by MTA and the City of Los Angeles.
