BUS FARE LOWERED AND SERVICE EXPANDED

MTA OPENS TWO NEW BUS STATIONS ON HARBOR TRANSITWAY

WHAT: MTA will hold a press conference to mark the opening of two Metro Bus stations on the Harbor Transitway that provide expanded bus service between the South Bay and downtown Los Angeles. Bus patrons now enjoy a new lower fare of \$1.35 and expanded service seven days a week from 5 a.m. to 10 p.m. The new Metro Bus stations at Pacific Coast Highway and Carson joined existing stations at 182nd St. (Artesia Transit Center), Rosecrans Ave., Harbor /I-105, with connections to the Metro Green Line, Manchester Ave., Slauson Ave. and 37th St. Free park/ride lots are located at all the stations except 37th St.
