Go Metro to the Hollywood Museum

Movie fans can visit Hollywood's newest major attraction easily via the Metro Red Line at Hollywood/Highland Station

The Hollywood Museum, Hollywood's newest major attraction, is an excellent vacation destination using a \$3 Metro Day Pass and the Metro Red Line this summer.

Located in the historic, landmark Max Factor Building across the street from the Hollywood/Highland Metro Red Line Station, the museum features four floors with 5,000 displays of past and present memorabilia any movie fan would enjoy, including movie sets, props, vintage photographs, costumes and much more.

The museum is now spotlighting Hollywood legend Bob Hope in an exhibit entitled "Bob Hope: Thanks for the Memories," a retrospective of his entire career, which runs until June 20. The exhibit features a one-of-a-kind display of Bob Hope's costumes, awards, posters, personal possessions, photography and other memorabilia.

Also on display are the famous Max Factor Makeup Rooms individually designed for blondes, redheads, brunettes and brownettes, which are restored to their original look of 1935 and filled with the world's largest collection of makeup.

Museum hours are 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Thursdays through Sundays. Admission is \$15 for adults, \$12 for seniors and students, and \$5 for children under five. Admittance to the Bob Hope exhibit is included in The Hollywood Museum's general admission fees.

The Hollywood Museum, at 1660 N. Highland Avenue, is located in the heart of the "New Hollywood" and is just steps from the Hollywood Walk of Fame.

Summer vacationers can visit The Hollywood Museum and other nearby Hollywood attractions by purchasing a \$3 Metro Day pass on board Metro Buses or at all Metro Rail stations. Day passes are good from the time of purchase until 3 a.m. the next morning.
