**Go Metro to Travel Show in Long Beach January 29-30**

Metro makes it easy to attend this weekend's Travel Show Jan. 29-30 at the Long Beach Convention Center in Long Beach.

The event, referred to as the West's largest and liveliest annual travel show, will give travel enthusiasts throughout L.A. County a chance to discover local and international travel destinations, attractions, resorts, and more. Event hours are from 10 a.m to 5 p.m. both days.

Show visitors can ride the Metro Blue Line and save \$5 in parking fees. Convention parking is \$8, but a round-trip Metro Day Pass can be purchased for just \$3.

The Metro Blue Line connects with Metro's other rail lines for convenient access to Long Beach from just about anywhere in L.A. County, including the San Fernando and San Gabriel Valleys, Westside, Gateway Cities and South Bay areas.

Once in Long Beach, visitors should exit the Metro Blue Line's Transit Mall Station and walk one block south to Ocean Boulevard where the Long Beach Convention Center is located.

Long Beach Transit Bus lines also serve the convention center: Lines 21, 22, 23, 111, 112 and Long Beach Passport A and D.

Metro Day Passes can be purchased on board Metro Buses or at ticket vending machines at Metro Rail stations.
