Go Metro to 'King Tut Returns' Exhibition at Los Angeles County Museum of Art

- LACMA just one of many cultural destinations available by Metro Bus and Rail

The wildly anticipated King Tut Returns Exhibition at the Los Angeles County Museum of Art (LACMA) will be much easier to get to if you go Metro.

With record attendance expected for this exhibition, L.A. County's transportation provider advises museum-goers to use frequent, direct public transit to visit museum grounds for the five-month stay beginning June 16 and ending November 15.

Metro provides direct service to the museum, located at 5905 Wilshire Blvd. in Los Angeles via Metro Rapid Line 720. Metro Rapid stops frequently at the corner of Wilshire Boulevard and Fairfax Avenue between Commerce and Santa Monica.

Additional bus services serving the area include Metro Lines 20, 21, 217, 317 (Metro Rapid Line 717 after June 26) and the Fairfax/Wilshire DASH bus. With the purchase of a \$3 Metro Day Pass, riders can utilize the entire Metro Bus and Rail system from the time of purchase until 3 a.m. the next morning. Passes can be purchased at Metro station ticket vending machines or on board Metro buses.

LACMA is just one of the many cultural destinations available via public transit. A wealth of other cultural destinations can be found at Experiencela.com. The site lists thousands of L.A. area travel itineraries for the discriminating cultural tourist.
