Mobility 21 Coalition Members Will Discuss State Infrastructure Proposal Feb. 10

Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger's \$222 billion infrastructure proposal that includes road, highway and rail improvements earmarked for Los Angeles and Orange counties will be discussed by California and Los Angeles city officials and transportation leaders at the next Mobility 21 Coalition meeting Friday, Feb. 10, 9 a.m. to 11:30 a.m., in the 1st floor conference room of the Caltrans District 7 Administration Building, 100 S. Main St., Los Angeles. Registration will begin at 8:30 a.m.

Scheduled to attend are California Senator and President pro Tem Don Perata, Los Angeles City Council Member Wendy Greuel, California Business, Transportation and Housing Secretary Sunne Wright McPeak and U.S. Congressman Earl Blumenauer (D-OR).

Mobility 21 is a countywide effort to bring together elected officials, transportation providers, businesses, local municipalities, labor and community leaders to develop solutions to the transportation issues facing Los Angeles County.

The initiative is being led by the Los Angeles Area Chamber of Commerce and Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority, in partnership with the Automobile Club of Southern California. The coalition has been actively advocating at the state and federal level on vital transportation issues including funding.
