## **Go Metro to the 14th Annual NoHo Theatre & Arts Festival**

Huge crowds and street closures will make driving there difficult but Metro riders can travel in comfort to the NoHo Theatre & Arts Festival, May 20 and 21 in North Hollywood. And they won't need to worry about parking.

Performances by Rock and Roll Hall of Fame legend, The Platters, and Mexican film and recording star Rosenda Bernal will highlight the 14th annual NoHo Theatre & Arts Festival, which is one of the largest drama and arts festivals in Southern California.

Live theater, music, dance, including the Carlos Gardel Tango Festival, fine arts, crafts and foods from around the world will be presented just steps from the North Hollywood station of both the Metro Red Line and the Metro Orange Line.
