Inspired by the ancient flood story, the Noah's Ark exhibit invites visitors to board a gigantic wooden ark and to play, climb, build, discover, nurture, problem-solve and collaborate alongside handcrafted, one-of-a-kind animals -- 186 species -- ranging from life-size elephants and giraffes to snow leopards, flamingos and iguanas.

Five years in the making and occupying an 8,000-square-foot gallery space, Noah's Ark at the Skirball will remain on view permanently. But starting in February, the special Metro \$2 discount deal will be applied to Bob Dylan's American Journey, 1956-1966, which opens Feb. 8 and runs through June 8 at the Skirball.
