LA METRO'S PHILLIP A. WASHINGTON HONORED AS CEO WHO "GETS IT"

The National Safety Council (NSC) has named LA Metro CEO Phillip A. Washington one of seven chief executives of major corporations and public agencies on its list 2016 CEOs Who "Get It," presented annually to leaders who demonstrate continued and outstanding dedication to employee safety and well-being both on and off the job.

"Part of that is remembering that we are in the service business and that all our customers deserve a safe environment."
