Rail transit finally returns to the Westside Metro CEO to Announce Expo 2 Grand Opening Date

WHAT:

Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro) Chief Executive Officer Phil Washington will join Metro Board members to announce the opening date this spring for the Metro Expo Line extension to Santa Monica. Santa Monica and nearby areas have not been served by rail transit since 1953.

The \$1.5-billion, 6.6-mile light-rail project from Culver City to Santa Monica will have seven new stations: Palms, Westwood/Rancho Park, Expo/Sepulveda, Expo/Bundy, 26th Street/Bergamot, 17th Street/Santa Monica College and Downtown Santa Monica.

The first phase of the Expo Line between downtown Los Angeles and Culver City opened in 2012. When the second phase opens, train trips between downtown Santa Monica and downtown L.A. will take 46 minutes, giving riders a great alternative to driving the often congested Santa Monica Freeway. Metro eases traffic.

The Downtown Santa Monica Station is just steps from some of our region's most popular attractions, including the Santa Monica Pier, Santa Monica Place, the Third Street Promenade, Tongva Park and Santa Monica State Beach. Other stations will help workers reach jobs in the media and tech corridors of West L.A. and Santa Monica.
