More to Explore when Metro Expo Line Opens to Santa Monica May 20

When the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro) opens the Metro Expo Line to Santa Monica on May 20, 2016, the new light rail extension will add seven new stations that will provide connections to a wealth of destinations on the Westside.

The \$1.5 billion, 6.6-mile extension will travel between Culver City and Santa Monica and provide a transit alternative to the busy 10 freeway, offering access to major shopping, sports, recreation, and educational destinations.

Metro is a multimodal transportation agency that is really three companies in one: a major operator that transports about 1.4 million boarding passengers on an average weekday on a fleet of 2,000 clean air buses and six rail lines, a major construction agency that oversees many bus, rail, highway and other mobility related building projects, and it is the lead transportation planning and programming agency for Los Angeles County.
