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Metro Deputy CEO Stephanie Wiggins to Host Interactive Telephone Town Hall Meeting For City of L.A. May 9 at 6:15 p.m.

Metro Deputy CEO Stephanie Wiggins will host an Interactive Telephone Town Hall meeting on Monday, May 9, at 6:15 p.m. to discuss the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority's potential transportation ballot measure.

Residents within the city of Los Angeles are encouraged to join Wiggins to discuss Metro's draft expenditure plan for a possible November sales tax ballot measure. The plan includes a timeline and funding amounts for a number of countywide transit, highway, pedestrian and bicycle projects over the next 40 years.

Wiggins will talk specifically about transportation projects of interest to the city of Los Angeles focusing on communities south of the Santa Monica Mountains including downtown and central Los Angeles, Hollywood, the Westside, South Los Angeles and the Harbor area.

Residents will be called at random by an automated telephone system and invited to participate in the public forums from the comfort of their homes. When residents answer their phones, they will be automatically connected to the meetings.
