The Metro Blue Line says "Hello/Goodbye" to New/Old Rail Cars

WHAT: After 27 years of service on the Metro Blue Line, the original P865 rail cars are being replaced with the new Kinkisharyo P3010 rail cars to enhance passenger service and improve vehicle reliability. A ceremony to commemorate the transition from the old to new rail cars will take place on June 21 at 10:30 a.m. in the Blue Line's main rail yard in northern Long Beach.

Nippon-Sharyo P865 rail cars have been in service since 1990 when the Blue Line opened for service between Long Beach and Los Angeles. Some of the old rail cars will be dismantled for parts and training purposes and the rest will be sold as "scrap" with a few cars saved for historical purposes. The new Kinkisharyo cars have been running on the Metro Expo and Gold Lines since 2016.
